1. Introduction

Biddick Academy is part of the North East Learning Trust and the uniform policy supports the high standards of the Trust and the Academy. At Biddick Academy we believe that a school uniform plays an important role in creating a focused and respectful learning environment. Our uniform policy is designed to promote equality, reduce distractions, instill a sense of pride and belonging among students whilst remaining as low-cost as possible. By wearing the correct uniform, students represent not only themselves but also the values and community of our school. This policy outlines the expectations for student dress and appearance, ensuring consistency and clarity for all members of the school community.

2. Aims

We believe that a clearly [defined](#) Academy uniform is important because it:

- **Promotes Equality**

To create a sense of fairness and reduce peer pressure by minimising visible economic and social differences among students.

- **Encourages a Sense of Belonging**

To help students feel part of the school community and take pride in representing their school.

- **Supports a Focused Learning Environment**

To reduce distractions and support a professional atmosphere that is conducive to learning and achievement.

- **Enhances Safety and Security**

To ensure students are easily identifiable as members of the school, both on-site and during off-site activities, improving overall safety.

- **Fosters Discipline and Responsibility**

To encourage students to take responsibility for their appearance and to understand the importance of following guidelines and expectations.

- **Prepares Students for the Future**

To help students develop habits of personal presentation that are important in many workplaces and formal environments.

3. Academy Uniform

The school uniform requirements are outlined in the table below, along with details regarding which items are optional and which need to be branded.

General Uniform

ITEM	REQUIRED/OPTIONAL	INFORMATION
Blazer with school badge	Required	The blue blazer is a branded item and must be purchased through the uniform supplier.
Shirt	Required	White collared shirt with top button. This must be smartly tucked in. Note: Shirts can be purchased from any high-street retailer.

Academy Tie	Required	Branded Biddick Academy tie. Can be purchased through the uniform supplier.
Jumper	Optional	Grey V-neck jumper or cardigan with the Academy badge. Note: Only available from the uniform supplier. No other alternatives are acceptable. Jumpers must be worn under the school blazer only.
Trousers	Required	Plain grey formal full length straight cut trousers - not leggings, jeans or stretch style. The bottoms of the trouser must be at least 7.5 inches/18 cm wide at the bottom. Note: Trousers purchased elsewhere MUST be the same style and fit as those provided by the uniform supplier.
Skirt	Required	Biddick Academy skirt Note: Skirts only available from the uniform supplier.
Socks/Tights	Required	Socks with trousers. Black opaque tights must be worn with skirts. Note: Can be purchased from any high-street retailer.
Shoes	Required	Plain black, formal leather or leather-look shoes that can be polished. Trainers, plimsolls, pumps, boots and ballet-style shoes are not permitted. Note: Shoes can be purchased from any high-street retailer.
School bag	Required	Can be purchased from any high-street retailer. Bag should be suitable to carry all equipment throughout the day. Note: Handbags are not acceptable

Outerwear

Item	Required/Optional	Information
Outside Coats	Optional	Outside coats must be removed upon entering the classroom. Note: Can be purchased from any high-street retailer.
Caps / Bucket hats		Caps / bucket hats are not to be worn on academy premises.
Woollen Hats	Optional	May be worn between the autumn and spring half terms but must be removed when entering the school building.

PE Kit

Item	Required/Optional	Information
Plain white t-shirt	Required	
Plain white t-shirt with Biddick logo	Optional	Note: Only available from the uniform supplier.
Bottoms	Required	Black shorts/tracksuit bottoms/black sports leggings. Note: It is required for students to have at least one of these items.
Black tracksuit bottoms with Biddick logo	Optional	Note: Only available from the uniform supplier.
Biddick Tracksuit Top	Optional	Note: Only available from the uniform supplier.

PE Footwear

Item	Required/Optional	Information
Trainers	Required	Trainers must have a textured sole that offers some grip. Flat soled trainers such as Nike AirForce One's, plimsolls, converse, or canvas type shoes are not

		acceptable. Note: Trainers with non-marking soles are to be worn in the sports hall.
Studded Boots	Optional	Note: Students can wear studded boots when participating in certain activities on the grass.
Moulded boots and Astro trainers	Optional	Note: Are allowed on the 3G sports pitch. However, metal studs, blades and flat sole trainers are not accepted.
Plimsolls, Converse, or canvas type shoes		Note: Not suitable footwear for PE and should not be worn.

4. General Appearance

Jumpers	Must be worn over trousers or skirts, not tucked in.
Hair	Hair should be a natural colour (one colour only). The Academy reserves the right to decide that the cut and colour of a student's hair is inappropriate. Tramlines, Mohicans, extreme short sides, longer on top are examples of styles that are deemed inappropriate. Hair bands should be thin and not overly decorated e.g., no large flowers.
Religious Head Coverings	Students may wear religious head coverings or garments (e.g. hijabs, turbans, kippahs) as part of their uniform, provided they are plain black or grey and meet health and safety standards.
Jewellery	Students are permitted to wear one stud in each earlobe. No other jewellery (this includes necklaces, bracelets and/or rings) or visible body piercings are allowed. Students will not be allowed to cover body piercings with Elastoplast. Parents must ensure that if a child is to have a piercing it must take place at the start of the six weeks' holiday and must be removed on the first day of term.
Make-Up	Students in Years 9, 10 and 11 can wear discreet, natural make-up. The Academy reserves the right to decide whether the amount of make-up a student is applying is inappropriate. Students are not permitted to wear false,

	gel or acrylic nails and/or garishly coloured nail varnish. For health and safety reasons nails need to be a sensible length, False eyelashes are not permitted. No fake tan is permitted.
Tattoos	Tattoos which are visible are not permitted. It is illegal to have a tattoo below the age of 18.
Clothing	Large fashion belts are not acceptable or part of the Academy uniform. Hoods must not be worn inside the Academy.
Equipment	All students are expected to come to the Academy with: • a bag large enough to carry an A4 file (backpacks are recommended) • a pencil case containing pen, pencil, ruler, and rubber Tutors and Year Managers will carry out equipment checks regularly Where a student repeatedly fails to bring the correct equipment to the Academy, his/her name will be passed on to the appropriate Year Manager. From then onwards, the Year Manager will apply a range of sanctions to ensure that the student brings the correct equipment to the Academy. These sanctions might include detentions, parental contact, internal exclusions etc.

The Academy reserves the right to make the final decision on what is acceptable and what is not acceptable.

Pre-Loved School Uniform

In an effort to ensure affordability and ease the financial pressures involved in purchasing uniform for our parents/guardians and their families, we have established a 'Pre-Loved School Uniform Shop'. This is also a means of reducing the amount of clothing that is wasted and sent to landfill, thus protecting the environment, and reducing our carbon footprint.

Students and families will then be able to obtain any items of uniform they need. The school contact is Mrs Garside, Standards lead.

As part of the Home-School Agreement our students and parents/guardians agree to conform to the uniform requirements of the school. Therefore, if parents/guardians or students are in doubt about whether or not a particular article of clothing is suitable, or before making any decisions about altering hair colour or style, we ask that they contact their child's Year Manager prior to any change.
